Key Verses	Matthew 1:1; 16:16; 20:28
Purpose	To prove that Jesus is the Messiah, the eternal King
Key Words	Fulfilled
Special Features	Matthew is filled with Messianic language and OT references (53 quotes and 76 other references). This Gospel was not written as a chronological account; its purpose was to present the clear evidence that Jesus is the Messiah, the Savior.
